

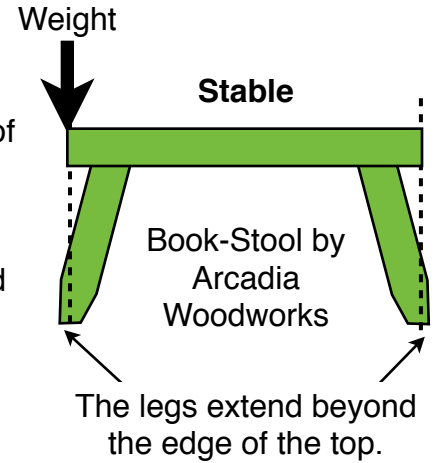


Book-Stool

The most important safety feature of any stool is that the bottom of the legs extend beyond the edge of the top.

On the Book-Stool, the bottom of the legs extend beyond the edge of the top on all four sides.

The weight of a child standing on the edge will still be supported and the stool will not tip over.

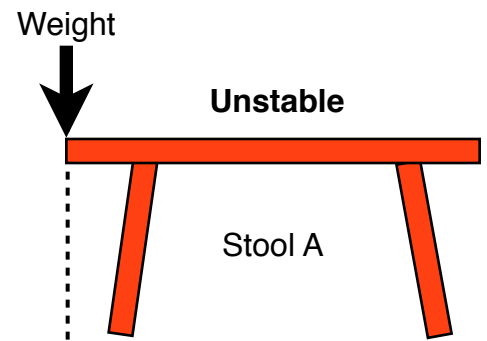


If a child stands on the edge of Stool A, B, or C, the weight is beyond the legs and the stool will tip over.



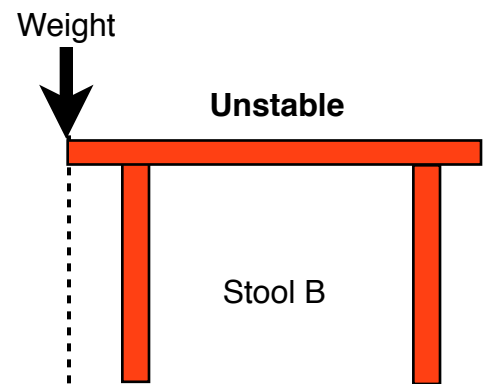
Stool A

Stool A looks stable because the legs are slightly angled, but it's not safe when standing on the edge. The top extends beyond the bottom of the legs.



Stool B

Stool B is very unstable when standing on any edge. The top extends beyond the bottom of the legs.



Stool C

Stool C is also very unstable when standing on any edge. The top extends way out beyond the bottom of the legs.
